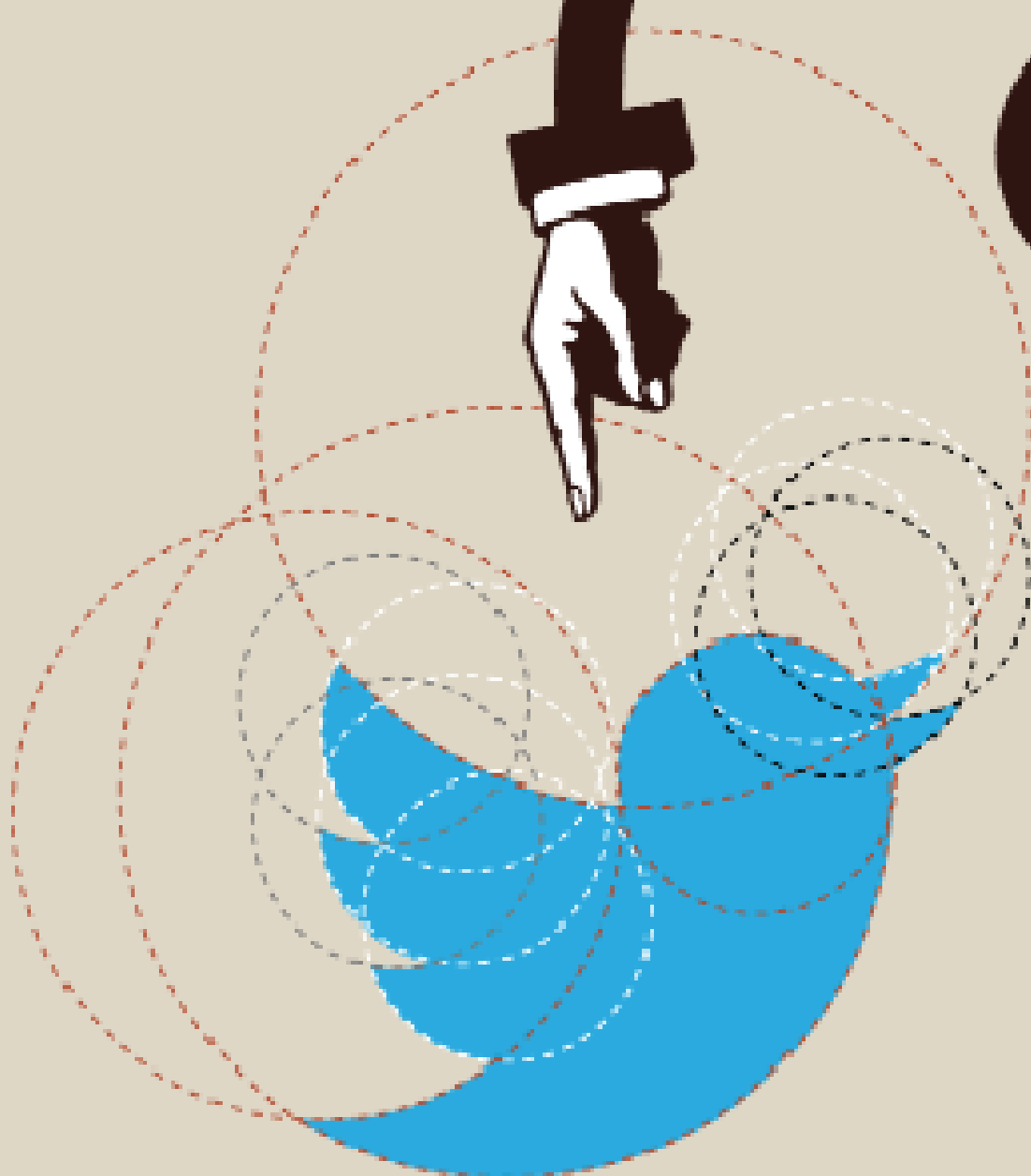
Without using any drawing tools (pen, pencil, brush or line), use the brown circles to create a Celtic knot like the orange example shown on the left.



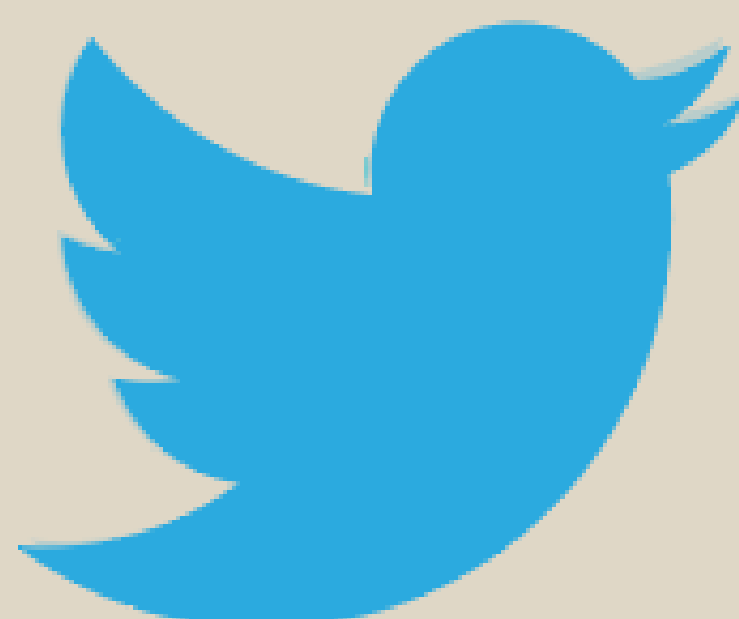

Stroke Width Tool

(Shift+W)

Click&Drag with the Stroke Width Tool (Shift+W) on the left anchor point of this line.

Thicken the stroke about a third of the way in.

Make four width adjustments in this order: from left to right: thick, thin, thick, thin

Now hold ALT while dragging and just pull width on one side.

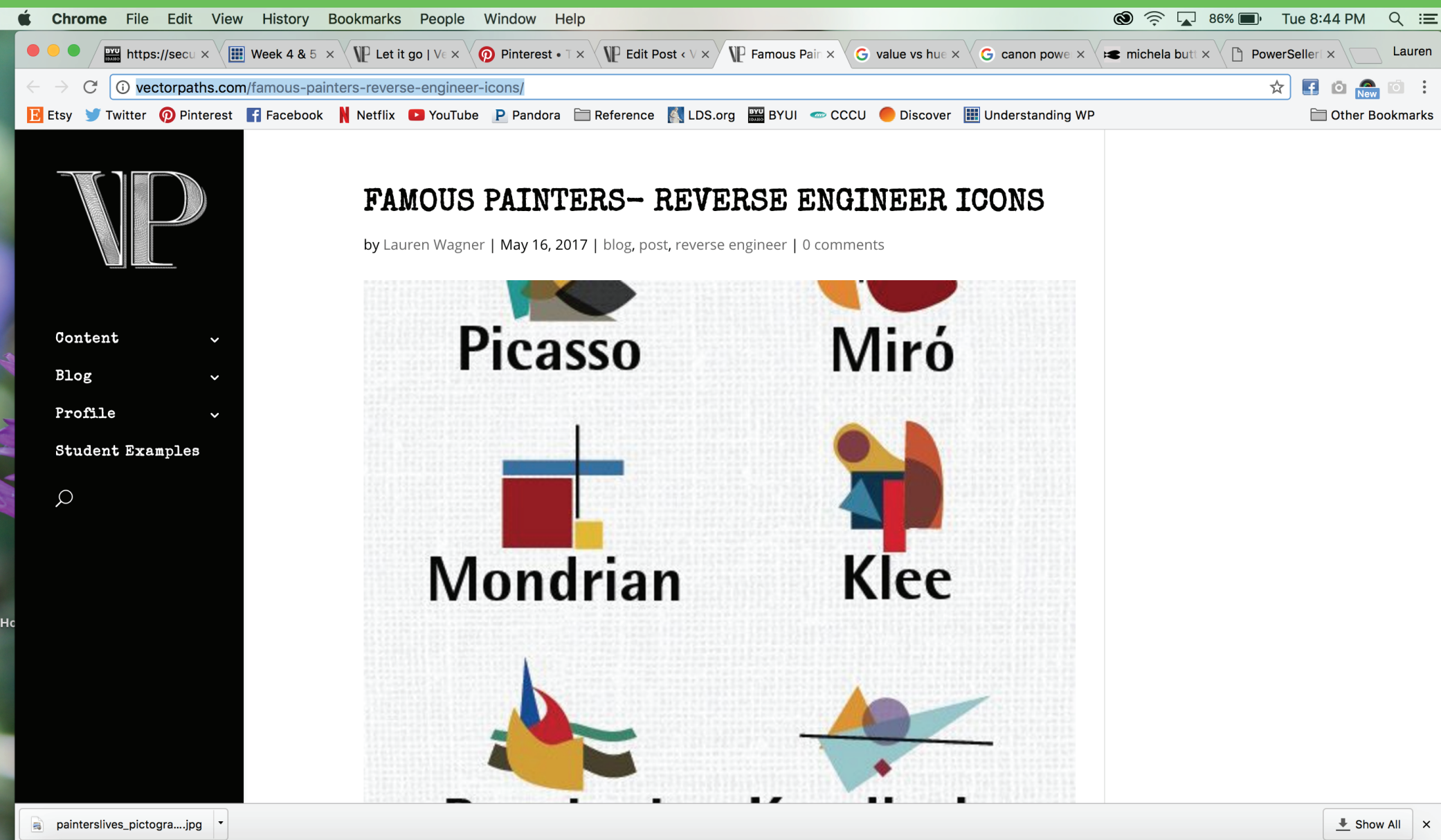
Notice how the termination of the stroke in the example matches the curve of the lines? Make copies of the lines, throw the stroke to the outside and increase the weight until it overlaps the green termination. Select the cop and new line and go to **Object > Path > Outline Stroke**. Use the **Shape Builder** Tool to cut the ends so that they match the examples. Change the color from green to orange.

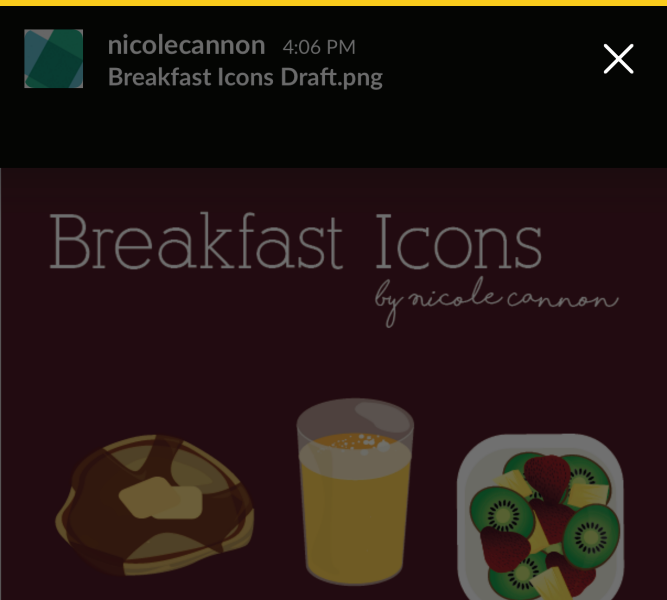


So for this project I did something that I love, and that is swimming! I did competitive swim for all four years of high school. It was a big part of my life and is still one of my favorite activities.

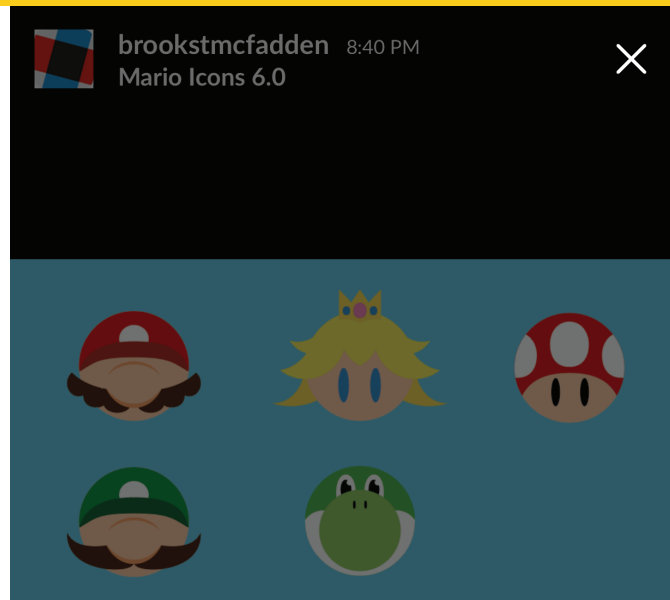

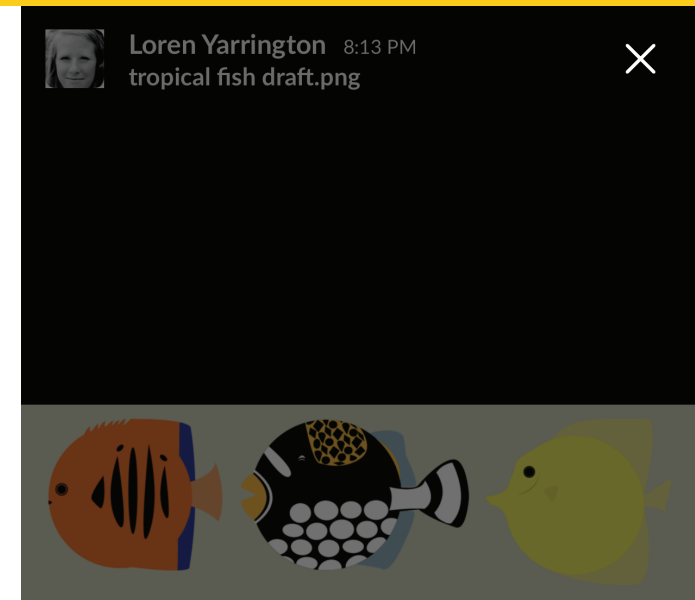
